Corporate Field Trips By Young Zhan

On Friday, Apr. 13th, the Actuarial Science Club organized a field trip to visit an insurance company, Prudential in Newark NJ, and another actuarial consulting firm, Towers Watson in Manhattan, NY. The field trip was attended by freshman actuarial students and some sophomores, aimed to provide a closer look at the "day-in-life" of actuaries. The field trip was purposely arranged to visit an insurance company and a consulting firm, in order to let students listen to the voice from both branches. Due to the limited seats we could provide for the transportation, we are sorry about not taking more of you. I was very fortunate to be the driver and join the field trip. I would like to share some gains with you.

One of the words we heard the most frequently in the day was communication. Recruiters want to hire people who are able to develop into future leaders of the business, not just someone who does the number crunching. For those who have taken Prof. Gebhardtsbauer's class, you might think about that he always asks us to express our actuarial knowledge in common terms like we are talking to our friends in McDonalds in downtown. That is exactly a skill needed in the real business world. While we are working in an insurance company for example, we will be facing people from the whole company. If we want some non-actuarial background people to understand our work, we need to be armed with the skills to explain our "actuarial present value" in the terms which they could easily catch.

Both companies held a panel discussion to allow students ask questions. One question

that students concerned was choosing a career as an actuarial consultant or choosing to work for insurance companies. One answer we heard is that consultants are closer to the front office, which means the company's profit could be tighten with the consultants. Actuaries for insurance companies are essential too. Actuaries in insurance companies not only need to understand their data, but also need to understand the overall business of the company. That's why communication is important and why
