

Studying Abroad - Fuad Ligali

Studying abroad is an opportunity that I strongly encourage everyone to participate in during their college career. Although actuarial science majors' schedules make it a little more difficult, there are ways to get around it. Last year May, I was able to go on a study tour of Egypt for 17 days.

Within the study tour, I traveled through the cities of Cairo, Luxor, Aswan, and Alexandria. I traveled with eight other students and two CAMS professors that specialize in Egyptology and Archeology. Each morning we would set out by bus and travel to different historical sites to get lectures on the



different monuments but none of it felt like a class. The amazing sights we saw and information we received was such a valuable experience to us. We started in Cairo where we saw the pyramids of Giza, the Great Sphinx of Giza, and many others. Not only were we able to climb a pyramid, we even went hundreds of feet down into a pyramid to see a tomb!

After Cairo, we went to Luxor where we went through tombs and museums of various pharaohs including Imhotep, Akhenaten, and many more. Within the ancient temples, our professor was able to read the hieroglyphics on the cartouches and decipher the ancient writings on the walls and ceilings. Once we arrived in Aswan we sailed on the Nile River for two days

Luckily, there is a silver lining. While we may not spend an entire semester abroad, Penn State does offer a wide breadth of short-term abroad options. For instance, I was able to study abroad in London this past Winter break for 10 days with Penn State's THEA 497H program. The trip to London was both very organized and very lenient. Most nights the entire group would convene to watch a different play, the tickets for which were purchased beforehand by the university. Other than that, however, we were on our own to explore all that the city had to



offer. Not only did we explore the London streets, for day trips to Windsor Castle and Hampton Court were merely a short train ride away. The trip itself was incredible and something that I will never forget. Watching one drama per night while exploring the city by day gave the entire class a genuine glimpse of British culture.

Most amazing of all, Penn State offers a plethora of varied short-term study abroad experiences. Some of the most notable are categorized under the RPTM (recreation, park, and tourism manage-

ment) course designation. Each one of these courses is a class and study abroad hybrid. They typically meet once per week in either the Fall or Spring semesters, and include a one or two week trip to places like Australia, New Zealand, and Fiji.
